We've already been given everything we need to live a life that will please God. All we need to do is take our relationship with Christ and let it flourish and grow in us. We are equipped to love others because of the experience we have with God's love. If anyone tells us different, then we are not to fall for it. We come from God and belong to God and therefore we have exactly what it takes to grow in His qualities. God's Spirit in us is stronger than anything that the world can throw our way.

NERO

Nero was a mess. He became emperor at age 16. When the capable advice of his mother interfered with his wishes, he had her killed. His first wife was falsely accused of adultery, divorced and executed. His next wife was kicked in the stomach in a fit of rage and died, along with the child she carried. The Roman Empire was weakened by Britain's revolt and then four years later a fire destroyed most of Rome. The unstable Nero found a handy scapegoat in the Christians who he subjected to all kinds of tortures. (Potter 66-68) Tradition holds that both Peter and Paul were killed in this time period: Peter crucified upside down, and Paul beheaded instead because of his Roman citizenship. (Lashway 1)

The first time that Paul was in prison in Rome, he lived in relative comfort under house arrest and was able to conduct a vibrant ministry and write many letters. This time conditions were more difficult.

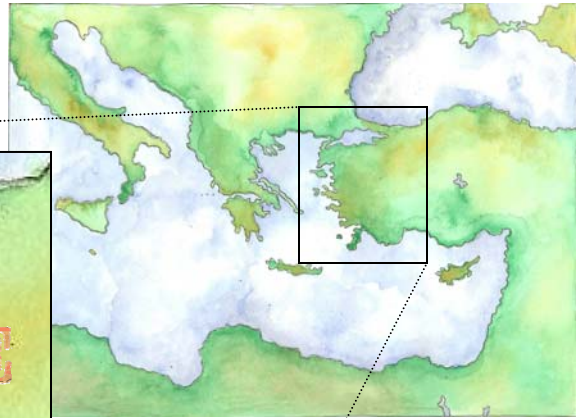
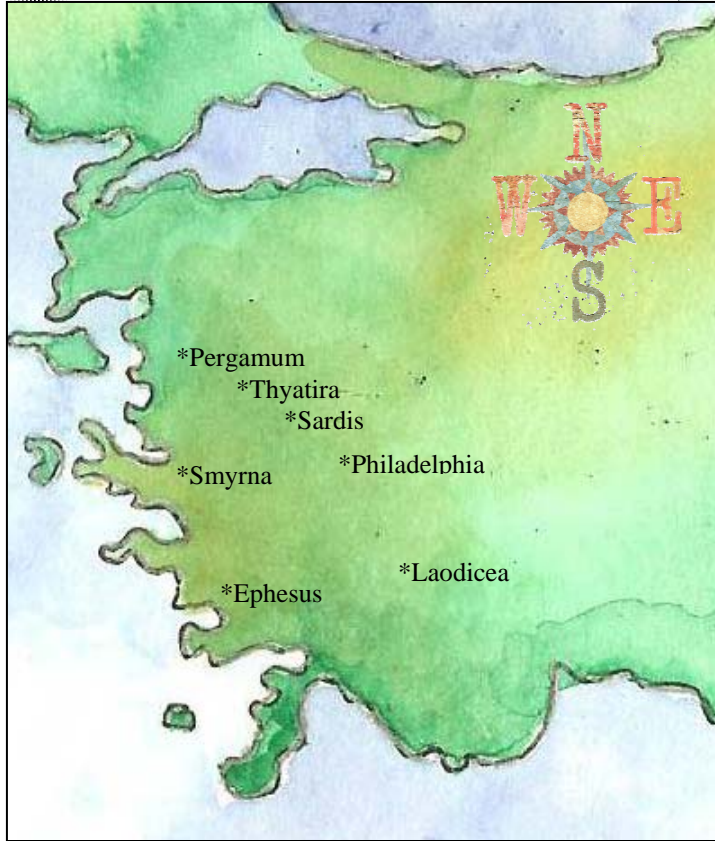

FALSE ADVERTISING 2 Peter

We don't talk much about false prophets today, but they are just as present and active as they have ever been. The tactic is still the same. Take the truth and twist it into a half truth that turns it into a counterfeit of the real thing. Take legitimate God given longings and provide a counterfeit and temporary fulfillment whose appeal can only be its immediacy. The world promises us so many things and the church is not immune to its lure because it sounds *almost* right. Sam Van Emen, in his book On Earth as it is in Advertising, coins an appropriate word for this: the "SimGospel", which he defines as "all messages that simulate the biblical narrative through advertising and popular media for the purpose of selling products and ideas." (Eman) The message of the false prophets that Peter warned against may not have been so different. They twisted God's message into something that had enough ring of truth, and enough false appeal, to make people buy into it.

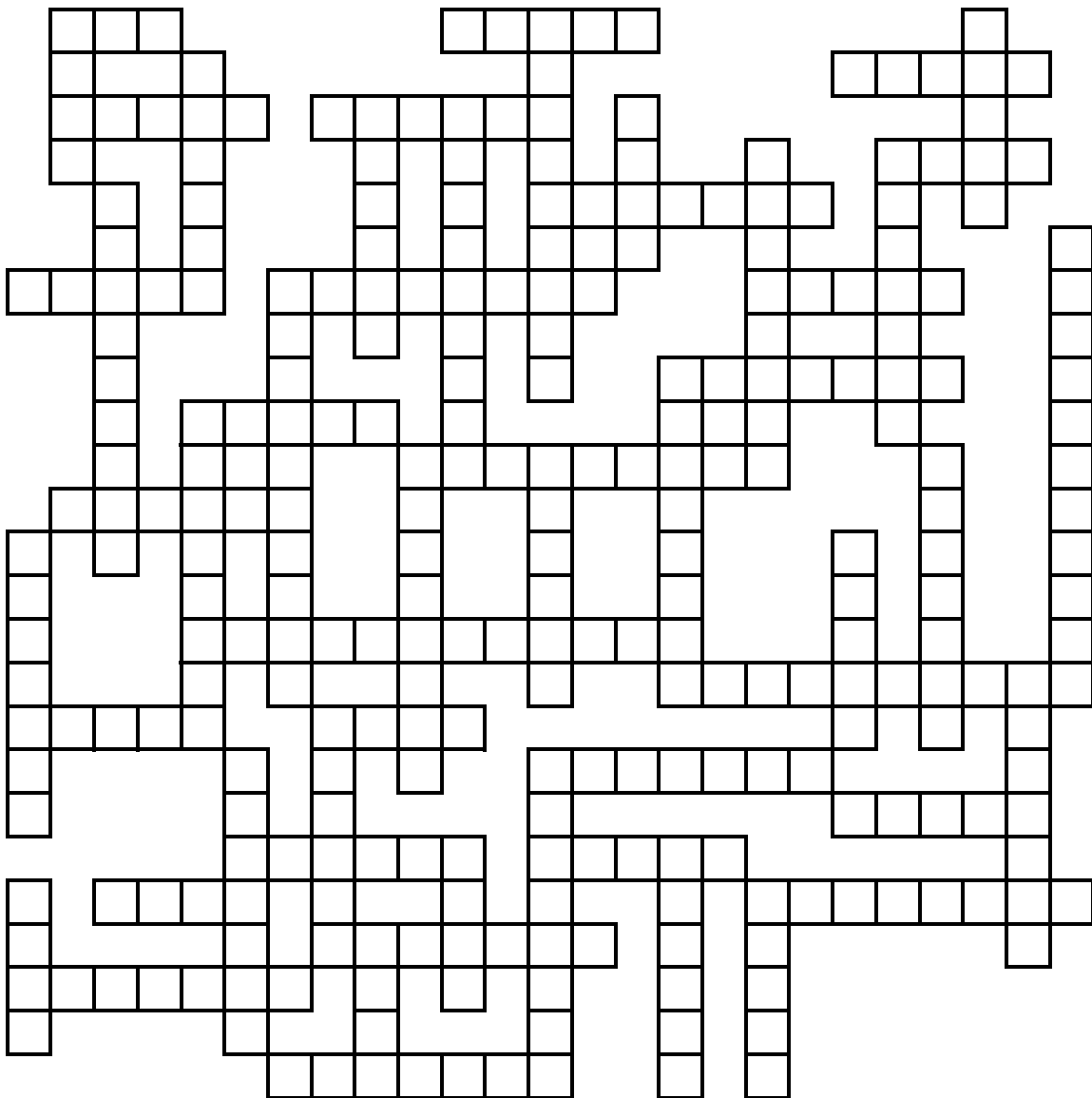
